Beat Priorities

Local officers and partner agencies continue to tackle a drug supply issue at two specific addresses within the beat area. One in Syston, the other in Thurmaston.

Thurmaston Retail Park/ McDonalds car park regarding anti social behaviour, car noise and speeding on surrounding roads.

Speeding continues to be an issue of concern to local residents across the breadth of Charnwood East beat area.

Updates on priorities

Warrants have been executed arrests made and actions taken to safeguard those potentially involved. One male remains under investigation whilst forensic examinations are done and the area remains a high patrol area for local officers to target.

This is a new priority and work has just begun with increased patrols. We will be monitoring complaints made to the police and council whilst taking enforcement action where offences are committed. Please report any issues on 101 so we can attend or at the very least build up our intelligence picture.

In August we carried out speed checks in Barkby Road in Syston, Melton Road in East Goscote and Hoby Road in Thrussington. Twenty motorists were stopped and four drivers were issued speeding tickets for exceed 30mph.
